UNDERSTANDING TITHES, OFFERING AND GIVING IN THE CHURCH

When it comes to church finances, terms like tithes, offerings, and giving often come up. These practices are rooted in Biblical teachings and play a significant role in the life of a church community. Let's delve into what these terms mean, their scriptural basis, and how the money collected is used to support the mission and ministry of the church.

Tithes: The Biblical Foundation

The term "tithe" comes from an Old English word meaning "tenth." Biblically, it refers to

- giving one-tenth of one's earnings to God. This practice is rooted in several scriptures:
 Leviticus 27:30 (NIV): "A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the Lord; it is holy to the Lord."
 - **Malachi 3:10** (NIV): "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."

Tithing is seen as an act of obedience and trust. By giving a portion of their income, believers acknowledge God's sovereignty and provision.

Offerings: Beyond the Tithe

Offerings differ from tithes in that they are given freely and voluntarily, above and beyond the tithe. Offerings are acts of generosity stemming from a grateful heart. Several scriptures highlight the importance of offerings:

- Proverbs 11:25 (NIV): "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed."

Offerings can be given in various forms, including money, time, and talents, and are often used to support specific needs within and beyond the church community.

- Acts 20:35 (NIV): "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive."




