MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,


Greetings! Leadership in ministry can manifest in many forms, each vital to the growth and nurturing of a faith community. As the Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 2:3-4, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." This scripture underscores the foundational priniciple that leading in ministry is not about personal glory but about serving the needs of others.

One of the most profound areas where you may be called to lead is in teaching and discipleship. This involves guiding others in their spiritual growth, helping them to understand scripture, and encouraging them to live out their faith daily. James 3:1 offers a sobering reminder about the responsibility that comes with this role: "Not many of you should become teachers, my fellow believers, because you know that who we teach will be judged more strictly." This scripture emphasizes the importance of integrity and careful stewardship of the Word when leading others in their faith journey.

Leadership in ministry can also extend beyond the walls of the church into the broader community. This might involve organizing outreach programs, leading service projects, or advocating for social justice. In these roles, leaders are called to be the hands and feet of Christ, exemplifying His love and compassion in tangible ways. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." This passage by Matthew challenges leaders to shine brightly, illuminating the path for others to follow and bringing glory to God through their actions.

The call to lead in ministry is a sacred and significant one, requiring a heart of service, a dedication to teaching truth, and a commitment to making a positive impact in the community.

Embracing the Call to Lead

In the last Messenger, we discussed tithes, offerings, and gifts. This week, our focus is on ministry leadership and what makes a good ministry leader. Are you a leader? Do you have leadership qualities? There's a good possibility that you do and you just don't know it or you haven't had the opportunity to tap into those skills yet. This list is not exhaustive, but it includes qualities that are accessible to everyday people and can be developed over time.

1. Compassion -A deep awareness of the suffering of others coupled with the desire to alleviate it. A good ministry leader is empathetic and cares deeply about the well-being of their community.

Example: A ministry leader who notices a congregant struggling with personal issues and takes the time to offer support and guidance.

2. Integrity - The quality of being honest and having strong moral principles. Integrity involves being truthful, fair, and consistent in all actions and decisions.

Example: A leader who admits when they've made a mistake and works to correct it, earning the trust of their community.

3. Humility - A modest view of one's own importance. Humility allows a leader to acknowledge their weaknesses and seek help when needed.

Example: A ministry leader who listens to the opinions and suggestions of others, valuing their input and recognizing that they do not have all the answers.

4. Patience - The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, trouble, or suffering without getting angry or upset. Patience is crucial for dealing with the diverse and sometimes challenging needs of a community.

Example: A leader who calmly and thoughtfully addresses the concerns of a congregant who is frustrated or upset.

5. Communication Skills - The ability to convey information effectively and efficiently. Effective communication involves listening as well as speaking, ensuring that messages are clear and understood.

Example: A ministry leader who delivers sermons that inspire and educate, while also

being approachable and open to conversations.

6. Vision - The ability to think about or plan the future with imagination and wisdom.

A visionary leader sets a clear direction and inspires others to follow.

Example: A leader who develops a long-term plan for community outreach and growth, motivating members to participate and contribute.

7. Service-Oriented - Having a focus on helping and serving others. A ministry leader prioritizes the needs of others and works tirelessly to serve the community.

Example: A leader who organizes volunteer events and actively participates in them, demonstrating a commitment to service.

8. Adaptability - The ability to adjust to new conditions. Being adaptable allows a leader to navigate changes and challenges effectively.

Example: A ministry leader who quickly shifts to online services during a pandemic to ensure the community remains connected.

9. Wisdom - The ability to make sound judgments based on knowledge and experience. Wisdom involves thoughtful decision-making and providing guidance that benefits the community.

Example: A leader who offers counsel to someone making a major life decision, drawing from personal experience and knowledge.

10. Enthusiasm - Intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. Enthusiasm is contagious and inspires others to engage and participate.

Example: A ministry leader who passionately leads worship services and community activities, energizing the congregation.

11. Accountability - The quality or state of being responsible for one's actions. A good leader acknowledges their responsibilities and holds themselves and others to high standards.

Example: A leader who transparently manages community funds and provides regular updates to ensure trust and accountability.

12. Resilience - The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties. Resilience enables a leader to persevere through tough times and emerge stronger.

Example: A ministry leader who supports their community through a crisis, maintaining a positive outlook and finding solutions.

13. Inclusivity - The practice or policy of including people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized. Inclusivity ensures that all members of the community feel valued and respected.

Example: A leader who actively promotes diversity and creates programs that welcome individuals from all backgrounds.

Embracing the call to lead in ministry is more than just stepping into a position of authority; it's about embodying qualities that resonate with everyday people. Effective leadership in ministry requires empathy, humility, and a genuine desire to serve others. It involves listening to the needs of the community, fostering an inclusive environment, and inspiring others through authentic actions and words. By cultivating these qualities, anyone can rise to the challenge and make a significant impact, demonstrating that true leadership is about guiding with compassion and integrity, no matter the setting. Let us all aspire to lead with a heart willing to serve and a spirit ready to uplift those around us.

Are You Ready to Lead?



Breast Cancer Awareness Month, observed every October, is a worldwide campaign to increase awareness about breast cancer, support those affected by the disease, and encourage early detection and timely treatment. This article aims to inform readers about breast cancer statistics, the importance of annual screenings, risk factors, and the symptoms that warrant a visit to the doctor.

General Information

Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women worldwide. It occurs when cells in the breast grow uncontrollably, forming a tumor that can often be felt as a lump. While it predominantly affects women, men can also develop breast cancer, albeit at a much lower rate.

Statistical Information

- Prevalence: Breast cancer continues to be highly prevalent, with an estimated 2.3 million new cases diagnosed globally in 2022. It accounts for about 11.7% of all cancer cases, making it the most commonly diagnosed cancer in
- Mortality: Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related deaths among women globally, accounting for approximately 685,000 deaths in 2020.
- Survival Rates: Early detection significantly improves the survival rate. The five-year survival rate for localized breast cancer (cancer that has not spread) is around 99%, according to the American Cancer Society (ACS).

Importance of Annual Screenings

- Early Detection: Annual mammograms can detect breast cancer early, often before symptoms develop. Early detection greatly increases the chances of successful treatment.
- Reduced Mortality: Regular screenings can reduce breast cancer mortality by 20-40% in women aged 40 to 74.
- Peace of Mind: Regular check-ups provide reassurance and help maintain overall breast health.

Risk Factors

While the exact cause of breast cancer is not fully understood, several factors can increase the risk:

- Age: Risk increases with age, particularly after 50.
- Genetics: A family history of breast cancer, particularly mutations in genes like BRCA1 and BRCA2, can significantly increase risk.



- Reproductive History: Early menstruation (before age 12) or late menopause (after age 55) can increase risk due to prolonged exposure to hormones.
- Lifestyle Factors: Obesity, excessive alcohol consumption, and lack of physical activity can elevate risk.
- Hormone Replacement Therapy: Long-term use of hormone replacement therapy can also increase risk.

Symptoms to Watch For

It is crucial to be aware of the signs and symptoms of breast cancer. Consult a doctor if you notice any of the following:

- Lumps: Any new lump or mass in the breast or underarm.
- Changes in Size or Shape: Unexplained changes in breast size or shape.
- Skin Changes: Dimpling, puckering, or redness of the breast skin.
- Nipple Changes: Inversion, discharge (especially if bloody), or changes in the appearance of the nipple.
- Pain: Persistent pain in the breast or nipple that does not correlate with the menstrual cycle.
